

Volunteer Land Steward Available Sites

Updated: December 6, 2021

Blue Sites are for Stewards that simply want to monitor an area: keep an eye out for wildlife, inventory plant species, or help with small projects like trash pickup.

Green Sites are for Stewards that want to get more involved: help INLC and project partners to plant trees and maintain them, identify and pull noxious weeds, engage trail users about trail etiquette, or get more involved in other land management tasks like sign installation or fence repair.

NOTE: INLC has broad stewardship agreements with City of Spokane Parks and Recreation and Spokane County Parks, so you can assume you have the ability to steward any of their properties, even if it isn't included in this list.
